What is HALN?

HALN is a UK-wide network for people responsible for, or interested in, anchor approaches in health. It was set up in February 2021 with funding from the NHS and The Health Foundation. We have 1600+ subscribers as of Feb 2023.

The network is free and open to join for colleagues from health organisations, like trusts, hospitals and CCGs; integrated care systems; primary care networks, regional bodies; and partners, like local authorities and other public agencies, voluntary, community and social enterprise sector, and education and housing organisations.

What does HALN do?

The network provides spaces and opportunities for participants to learn with peers and experts about how anchor organisations can consciously use their resources, influence and work in partnership to improve the social determinants of health and help reduce inequalities. Our activities include:


